Good morning,

I wanted to take this opportunity, early in the New Year, to remind you that the deadline for submission of responses to the consultation on Gatwick Airport's draft master plan is just one week away. The consultation will close at **5pm on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2019** and any response forms received after that deadline will not be included in our analysis.

When we launched our draft master plan on 18<sup>th</sup> October, we made a suite of consultation materials available on our website. We supplemented this by placing copies of our draft master plan in nine local libraries (see list below) and then held six public exhibitions during November which were very well attended by local residents and businesses. Throughout this period we have also responded to queries via our dedicated email and Freephone channels and attended dozens of formal and informal meetings to discuss the draft master plan. We are delighted by the level of engagement and feedback that we have received.

The views of the local community and its elected representatives are very important to us. If you have not yet taken the opportunity to respond, we would encourage you to do so; similarly, we would be grateful for any support you might wish to provide in sharing the details of the consultation.
